



## RPSBS LTD DIRECTOR REPORT TO WA STATE ANNUAL MEETING 2020

As in previous years this report commences with a message from the RPSBS Directors thanking the state committee members and volunteers for their efforts on behalf of the members of our Society. State committees, through the events they organise, provide the reason for so many competitors retaining their RPSBS membership and continuing to support the Society.

2020 is one of the most challenging years for Australians and for our Society's members. The most severe drought; the most severe bush fires; and now the most severe pandemic combine to pose enormous challenges for the Society.

COVID-19 has instantly transformed our lives and we all have had to rapidly adjust to a new reality. Adaptation and innovation will be essential for our Society. The Board of Directors met on 1 April 2020 successfully using video conferencing for the first time. A RPSBS National Foal show and children's colouring competition are being held online and the 2020 Annual General Meeting will be conducted online.

Due to social distancing regulations all 2020 RPSBS Ltd. State Annual Meetings have been replaced with an online reporting system. Audited financials, Chair, Director and Treasurer reports and 2019 State Annual Meeting minutes are being posted on the respective state web sites together with the names of newly elected committee members.

In 2019 the South Australian and Western Australia committees were placed in Administration when the number of elected members fell to less than three. Both states formed new committees at Special Meetings of State Members. All costs incurred in the election of new SA and WA committees were borne by the Society.

Changes in Board Directors during the 2019 – 2020 year were Kathryn Thomas replaced Eileen Morris as the Director elected by the WA Committee, Dr. Andrew Hunt replaced Alyson Emery as the Director elected by the SA Committee and Sandra James replaced Ashley Cooper NSW upon his resignation. Debra Watson, a past Arabian Horse Society Treasurer, has taken on the dual role as Company Secretary and Treasurer. Teresa Edwards has taken on the role of Board minute secretary replacing Helen Dohan who remains the Society's Registrar.

The Leader Board competition for 2019- 2020 concluded in April. The Board has funded the \$4,200 prize money associated with the competition and the trophies were funded by sponsorship of Barastoc Horsefeeds, Supreme Horseware, Duncan Equine Group and Hufgloken. The competition was expanded to 10 categories this year. Recognising that members of the smaller states have far fewer opportunities to gain Leader Board points, \$200 prize money has been awarded to the highest point scorer in each state.



The start of the next competition has been delayed until competition recommences throughout Australia. We congratulate the following WA members:

The Board is absolutely committed to supporting our state committees however the Society will have to examine the financial situation as the full impact of COVID-19 and the resulting economic downturn manifests itself. It is highly likely that such items as show subsidies will only be approved in situations in which states are suffering financial hardship.

On behalf of all RPSBS members, the Directors welcome the new state committee members and thank all past members for their efforts.

The Board wishes every member and their families the very best in this time of hardship and uncertainty and is confident that our beautiful ponies will help us weather this storm.
